Capitalization Policy Worksheet

Not all of the choices on this worksheet are mutually exclusive. For instance, you might decide that in general you will capitalize all words of four or more letters but also capitalize the "little words" on a special list.

Always capitalize the first word, even articles Capitalize the first word unless it is an article

After Colons
Always capitalize the first word after a colon, even articles Capitalize the first word after a colon unless it is an article

Hyphenated Compounds Always capitalize the first element
Capitalize the first element unless the next element is a proper noun or adjective
Capitalize elements according to the other rules you have chosen to follow
Proper Nouns with Initial Lowercase Letter Always capitalize the first letter
Capitalize the first letter only when it starts a title or sentence
Leave the initial lowercase letter
